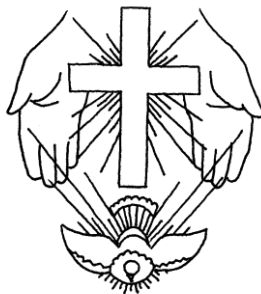

CALVARY GARDEN: Now that lockdown restrictions have been eased and parks are open, when the weather is fine chairs will be put out in the Calvary Garden at the side of the Church for prayer. Please maintain social distancing.

CORONAVIRUS: Advice for preparing churches for gradual reopening is constantly being updated. It looks likely that there will be an increased need for stewards (preventing overcapacity within social distancing constraints in church), volunteers to help with sanitising arrangements and church deep cleaning, and also to assist in one way traffic through churches which is recommended. Provision of masses in church seems likely to be later than opening for private prayer. People who are understandably frustrated by churches not being open for individual prayer are encouraged to write to their MPs.

THE SVP is a Catholic charitable society whose aim is 'faith in action'. The school 'Mini Vinnies' club are affiliated to the parish SVP group. Our parish SVP group do daily deliveries of food & supplies to Food Banks, homeless shelters, as well as to drop in centres for asylum seekers & refugees. Due to the current situation, the main Food Bank that they work with are desperately short of provisions and are struggling to meet demand for the most deprived areas of Birmingham. They need urgent donations of food, cleaning products, toiletries and baby products on a large scale. Donations can be dropped off at the school or local addresses for the SVP team to collect every Thursday. Addresses of local drop-off points and newsletters, for an update on how things are going, can be found on the parish website.

SMBC have also launched the 'Here 2 Help' web pages which contain information about how residents can get help with food, money advice, wellbeing etc. This includes key contact details which you may find very useful if you need to signpost residents for additional support. 1. Bank Transfer of Offertory donations

- If you are not a gift aider the reference should be "**Offertory**"
- Parish account details: **Please 'phone the parish to obtain details**

3. You can set up a Standing Order but this would, of course, continue after the Covid-19
